From establishing medical services in remote communities in Sierra Leone in the 1950s and 60s through to leading the development of hospice and bereavement services in Hertfordshire, this is an account of determination, courage and faith.

Dr Mary Groves was awarded the MBE in 2014 for services to missionary work in Sierra Leone and Hospice work in St Albans.
